## LEVEL 8 for Disruptive Rain

WARNING valid Wed 03 Jun 10:00 Until Thu 04 Jun 22:59

### Affected DM / LM / Metro area

Kouga, Kou-Kamma, Ndlambe, Nelson Mandela Bay, Sundays River Valley

### Short Message

Disruptive rain leading to widespread flooding of settlements, roads, low lying areas and bridges is expected in places over Koukamma LM, Kouga LM, Sundays River LM, Ndlambe LM and Nelson Mandela Bay Metro from Wednesday to Thursday.

### Discussion

Ridging in high-pressure system with cut-off low in the upper level of the atmosphere, these two systems will result in cold conditions with snowfall over high lying areas and rainfall across the province. 100 to 200mm is expected in places over Kou-Kamma, Kouga, Sundays River Valley and Ndlambe LMs as well as Nelson Mandela Bay Metro where an Orange Level 8 warning has been issued. An Orange Level 5 warning has been issued over Ngqushwa and Makana LMs (50 to 100mm), while a Yellow Level 2 warning has been issued for Dr Beyers Naude, Blue Crane

### Impacts

Widespread flooding of settlements (formal/informal), roads and bridges.  
 Damage to infrastructure.  
 Difficult and dangerous driving conditions due to slippery roads and reduced visibility.  
 Mudslides and rockfalls  
 Prolonged disruptions and communities being cut-off.

### Instruction

Listen for regular weather updates via radio and/or social media.  
 Postpone travel arrangements until it is safer to travel.  
 Avoid crossing rivers and swollen streams.  
 Monitor the weather conditions and if need be, identify areas to safely store valuable items from flood water.
